
Maslow's Humanistic Theory of Personality

- Maslow's Humanistic Theory of Personality states that people achieve their <u>fullest potential</u> by moving <u>basic needs</u> to <u>self-actualization</u>.
- Maslow focused on subjective experiences, such as: free will and the innate drive toward self-actualization.
- Maslow believed self-actualizers indicate a <u>coherent personality</u> <u>syndrome</u>.
- He also believed that human needs change throughout an individual's lifespan which lead to the theory of Heirarchy of Needs.

Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs:

- In 1943, Maslow stated that people are motivated to achieve certain needs.
- When one need is fulfilled a person seeks to fulfill the next one.
- This 5 stage model can be divided into basic needs.
- The deficiency, or basic needs are said to motivate people when they are unmet and the need becomes stronger over time.

Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs:
